The promotion of economic, social and cultural rights in the era of multidimensional crisis : Challenges and opportunities

## Thursday, July 6th, 2023, 15h- 16h, in Palais des Nations (Room XXV)

Economic, social and cultural rights (ESCR) are the backbone of human rights, in the sense that they are essential for respecting human dignity and achieving social justice. Yet violations of these rights are widespread and systematic under the current economic and social system which sacrifices people's basic needs (such as food, health, housing, education) in the name of the quest for economic growth and profit maximization for a small minority.
